EDOC 4: Final Draft "Risk" Program Note

This year's theme is a single word: risk. Of course, even having this overly broad theme is itself a risky venture. Tonight you get to decide if it was a risks worth taking.

But I can think of no better theme for a community of artists to explore than risk; the very act of entering into the creative process is risky business, and the outcome, of course, is neither guaranteed nor certain. Everything about the artistic life—especially one as communal and technical as film making—risks failure at every turn. If we can't take risks, then we can't do art because art is always an act of faith, "the evidence of things hoped for, the substance of things not yet seen."

Risk implies at least four things. First of all, it implies conflict—the very heart of story. There must be a conflict in competing values for risk to be at work. "Is the thing I have worth losing in order to gain what I do not have?" It also implies the conflict inherent in failure: "What consequences flow if I don't succeed?" It is precisely these kinds of calculations that drive us to inaction, and worse, disobedience unless we somehow find the courage to run the gauntlet of our worst fears.

Risk also implies a kind of virtue—the willingness to sacrifice something of value in
the pursuit of something else. Of course,
what fires that willingness need not be
"moral" virtue (greed, lust and envy come to
mind) but the willingness to extend beyond
one's immediate horizons stands in contrast
to those who might fail to act for equally
problematic motives such as sloth and fear.

 Trembling grooms at the altar and anxious day traders at their keyboards might be at their tasks with less than pure motives, but the willingness to act in the face of their fears is something that all of us at one time or another have lacked.

Third, risk implies life. You must at least have a pulse in your veins if you are to engage in risk-taking behaviors; only the dead have no desires. We live under the illusion that we can control outcomes. The only certainty in this life is that life is uncertain-except, of course, that death awaits us all. (Another theme for a much more maudlin kind of film race.) Philosophers and poets affirm the notion that life lived in fear of risk is no life at all. And Christ himself warned that the person who seeks to save his own life will lose the life God intends for us, but those of us willing to risk what we now have in exchange for what God intends for us have everything to gain. Following Christ is the riskiest business of all. But what a wild ride!

Finally, risk is what God is all about. When God created us in His image, He gave us free will, and in so doing, He risked that we would choose imperfection over perfection, brokenness over completion, self over Other. And yet knowing all of these things in advance, He still chose the riskiest path of all: love. And it is this risk-taking love through Sacrifice that is reconciling the whole of creation to itself and to Him. I agree with C.S. Lewis that God is not safe (though He is good) but the reason He is not safe is because he doesn't "play it safe" and neither should we.

It is my great privilege to present to you the films of EDOC 4: Final/Cut/Draft. title of this year's race has a double meaning-for the first time in our history we're going to honor the gift of writing which is an essential part of the film making pro-The other meaning is that we're not at all sure that there will be an EDOC 5 inasmuch God is leading my family and I on to other paths. It has been an amazing journey to walk with all of the folk who have participated in all the EDOCs of the past, but it has been a particular blessing to labor with the folk who have helped put this thing together this year. My heartfelt thanks to all of the Jury-who wish to remain anonymous-and, of course, to the Board of Common Grace Ministries and to my best friend, comrade and "boss" Martin Hironaga, without whom this grace venture called EDOC would never have been possible.
